

Notes for October Gardening-

1

Select and plant **spring blooming bulbs** this month and next.



Keep tulips, daffodils and hyacinths cool until the weather outside is wintery. They benefit from being refrigerated for 4 to 6 weeks. Plant them by Thanksgiving weekend. Plant iris, freesia and others now.



Plant holiday favorites now. Plant hollies and other berry producing shrubs for winter decoration indoors and out. Try pomegranates and persimmons for ornamental and edible fruit.



Fall is a great time for branching out! Spring isn't the only time to expand your landscaping horizons. The cool days and warm soil of autumn gives all kinds of trees, shrubs, and bulbs a great start. And when you add a little greenery to the scenery, the value of your home blossoms. Plan on planting this fall.



Make sure to **keep your gardenia green** this winter. Feed with *Master's Azalea, Camellia, Gardenia Food and Iron Sulfate*. When the soil cools they can no longer absorb nutrition.



Plant sweet peas from seed or transplants for late winter bloom. Choose old-fashioned climbing types or newer bush varieties. Protect them from snails and slugs with *Corry's Snail, Slug, and Insect Control* or *Sluggo Plus*.



Last chance for winter vegetables from transplants. Protect them from cabbage worms with *Safer's Caterpillar Killer*, a safe biological control.



Onion, Garlic and Shallot Sets Are In! Ready to plant now for harvest next summer. Choose from red, yellow, or white onions, shallots and white or pink garlic. Place onion bulbs 3 to 4 inches apart in rows that are 15-18" apart. Begin to harvest the green tops in 3 to 4 weeks, if you like. Onions and garlic are shallow rooted plants, so keep them moist and free of weeds. Winter rains will soon do all the watering for you, making onions and garlic some of the easiest vegetables to grow in the garden.



Keep Hydrangeas Blue. Start now for bright blue Hydrangeas. Hydrangeas petal color is influenced by soil pH. Alkaline soils produce pink flowers, Acidic soils produce blue. Fall is the time to start monthly applications of *Master Nursery Hydra Blue* for bright blue hydrangeas.



- Greg **Disneyland (2004)** Absolutely enchanting, unique copper/orange/apricot/pink blooms put on a fun filled summer long parade to make your yard the happiest place on earth.

- Gerry Cinnamon Dolce (2013) Unique smoky-brick red flowers with exhibition form, strong fragrance, and excellent disease resistance.
- Anthony Blue Girl (1964) her lavender blue color comes as close as it gets, she has a nice fruity fragrance and long stems that are great for cutting.
- Dee Fragrant Cloud (1968) Lots of large shapely blooms with a delicious, heady perfume effuses from the well-formed, classically shaped coral-orange blooms.
- Robin **Ketchup & Mustard (2012)** As our sales rep. says "Hot Dog!" attention grabbing red & yellow twotoned color set atop the greenest, glossiest leaves makes a bold and beautiful statement in your yard.

Tasty Stews Start with Homegrown Vegetables

If you haven't planted your winter vegetable garden yet – DO IT NOW! The vegetable starts are here now with fresh shipments arriving weekly. Use our **Recipe for Good Garden Soil** (see below) and then get ready to plant.

Fresh carrots, onions, cabbage will all taste great in winter stews and casseroles. Come in and choose now. We have: kale, spinach, chard, lettuce, celery, broccoli, brussel sprouts, cauliflower, cabbage, peas, winter hardy herbs, and much more. Garlic is available in bulbs, onions come in seed, bulbs and



plants. Radishes, carrots, turnips and beets can be planted from seeds.

Rhododendron, Azaleas, Camellias & Care For Fall

This is the month to switch from growth to bloom food for azaleas, camellias and rhododendrons. From October to the finish of bloom feed monthly with **Master Bloom**. This phosphorous rich food is great for flower bud development. Rose and lilac growers have also reported that fall and winter applications of Master Bloom have enhanced bloom, too.

Plant Cool Season Annuals



Pansies and their cousins, **violas**, are some of the most colorful and long lasting cool weather annuals. They

begin blooming as the temperature cools, and continue through the winter and early spring. Pansies and violas are popular because of their huge range of colors and adaptability to many different garden situations. But don't think that's all we have to offer!

Perhaps the most popular of the winter bloomers is the **sweet pea**. These fragrant, colorful plants come in bush and vining types. Available in a variety of single or mixed colors, they are easy to grow from seed or nursery plants. The bush types make good cut flowers – you can bring color into your home in the middle of winter!

Come on into the nursery for excellent quality and great selection. Choose from: ornamental kale and cabbage, Iceland poppy, English primrose, fairy primrose, and primula obconica. Don't forget snapdragons, and stock.

Recipe for Good Garden Soil!

GOOD GARDEN SOIL!

For each 100 square feet add:

- 5 to 8-2 cubic ft. bags Master Gold Rush or Bumper Crop ®
- 5 lbs. Iron Sulfate to acidify and add iron.
- 10 lbs. Master Vegetable Food or Master Flower Food, Master Formula 49 can be used for ground covers.
- 50 lbs. **Gypsum**. It loosens hard soils as it adds sulfur & calcium. (An excellent addition in our heavy soil.)

Mix well with your soil to an 8" depth and water well.
