Protect Your Plants from "The Big Chill"

• If there's room indoors bring in small potted porch or patio plants choosing an area that provides bright light.

• Wrap plants with new **protective plant bags** or a **protective frost blanket** – a spun material that breathes easily but keeps out cold air.

• For outdoor plants simply remembering to keep them well watered in between rain storms is a plus.

• Spray the leaves of frost tenders like: citrus, tropical hibiscus, philodendron, bougainvillea, with CLOUD COVER monthly through the winter. This product coats the leaves and stems providing 2 to 3

degrees of protection.



• Decorate cold sensitive plants with outdoor Christmas tree lights. The heat radiated moderates the cold air temperatures. You can maximize this heat source by draping or tenting your plants with translucent "plant blanket" material to create a greenhouse effect. The plant blanket alone will give you 2 to 3 degrees of protection and may be left on all winter.

• Go down to your local hardware store and pick up pipe insulation. It's not only great to keep water pipes from freezing but works wonders when used to protect the trunks of small trees. This pre-split foam tubing is so easy

simple, living gift to warm a heart and a home. Plant a bunch of bulbs in a low container filled with pebbles. Water and watch them grow indoors. They will bloom within six weeks. When finished blooming, they can be planted permanently outdoors.


Create a nice gift by filling a standard 6" terracotta pot with

soil and bulbs and inverting a clay saucer over the top for a lid. Tie it all together with a raffia bow. Once watered, this pot full of bulbs will begin to grow and if kept indoors, will bloom in about 6 weeks.

Enormous Amaryllis

Amaryllis bulbs were a seasonal favorite of my grandmother's and their instant results and huge flowers make them a holiday favorite still today. Simply plant the large bulbs indoors in a pot of soil, water them and watch them bloom within four weeks. They are so easy, sometimes they even bloom before they are planted! They make a nice house warming gift or select one for yourself.

Again this year we are featuring a collection of the largest amaryllis bulbs on the market. These are enormous 44 cm bulbs. You have to see them to believe how big they are – as big as coconuts. We have them in the traditional red, the elegant white and nice combination red & white. Also this year, we have included in our collection a beautiful, deep burgundy colored amaryllis (a more conservative 34 cm) the color is such a dark red I'm sure it will be a show stopper.

After your amaryllis blooms, remove the spent stem but nurture the leaves with regular care and feeding. Place the pot outdoors after danger of frost passes and keep it watered while the long, strap-like leaves replenish the bulb. At summers end, lay the pot on its side so it receives no water, allow the leaves to wither and just as winter approaches, pick the pot up, remove all the dry foliage, then begin to water it again, it will bloom for you year after year.

Notes for December Gardening-

- Come on by the nursery and **pick up a gift card** for your favorite gardening pal, the postal carrier or the baby-sitter. It's a gift sure to please anybody and everybody on your shopping list.
- Protect fruit trees and deciduous shade trees from over wintering diseases and pests. Use Lily Miller Microcop Copper Dormant Spray plus Sta Stuk.
- Protect frost tender plants when frosts are expected. Spray with Cloud Cover, use Fast Start Plant Blanket Fabric to cover. String Christmas tree lights on your frost tender plants when a freeze is expected. The warmth from the bulbs will provide another measure of protection.
- General pruning workshops will be held Sunday, December 7th and Saturday, December 13th at 1 p.m. Plan on attending one of these informative seminars and find out the pruning basics including how to shape deciduous trees and shrubs, prune fruit trees properly or get any of your own pruning questions answered. A nut tree pruning class will be held on Saturday, December 20th at 11 a.m.
- Prune most fruit trees, roses and other leafless trees and shrubs from December through January. WARNING:
 Do not prune spring blooming shrubs and trees such as lilac, quince, flowering cherry etc. until the blooming period is over.

Benaya . . . Handcrafted Art on Tile

For centuries, hand painted porcelain and ceramics have been revered and collected by people of all walks of life and cultures. These beautiful and unique artistic tiles by Benaya are handcrafted, hand painted and fired with brilliantly colorful and complex glazes. The styles range from subtle to dramatic with quality being the unvarying element.


The artistic process is extremely labor intensive. The first step is to draw the image on the rough tile surface and then carefully apply the relief work which creates the unique three-dimensional outline. The

ceramics are hand painted in several layers of glazes that enrich the textures and vibrant colors.

The tiles are fired in kilns for 24 hours at temperatures reaching 1000 degrees Celsius (1800 Fahrenheit). A full day is needed in the kilns to ensure that the artwork sets into the body of the tile creating a permanent image that will never dull or fade.

Next time you're in the nursery stop by to pick up some fresh Christmas greens to bring that fragrant scent into your home for the holidays. Alden Lane has cedar garland, mixed greens garland, fresh wreaths ranging in size from 24" to 32", cinnamon scented pine cones, mistletoe and noble fir and cedar door hangers and others. Get festive and spread holiday cheer through out your home.

Winter Wonder Evergreens

Our classic conifer selections for winter are here, and now is a great time to plant. These rugged, cold hardy trees and shrubs have a place in every garden. There are many new selections of dwarf conifers for those looking for elegant low maintenance in a small space or container garden. The bright gold of Golden Hinoki Cypress are sure to bring life to a dormant winter garden. Columnar conifers such as Emerald Green Arborvitae, Harrington's Plum Yew, or Columnar Mugo Pine all make great anchors for perennial beds. We also have a few options or living Christmas trees including the classic Colorado Blue Spruce and sheared Redwoods for indoor holiday accent. Dwarf Alberta Spruce is an excellent potted living Christmas tree for the porch or patio.

Here are some helpful hints to keep your living Christmas tree healthy and happy. This is a hard one - try to minimize its indoor time. A week to ten days is a good maximum to be in the house. Choose a well lit area away from the heat of a fireplace or furnace. Protect the floor with a cork trivet topped with a large saucer to catch the watering water. In between deep waterings (use a turkey baster to relieve

excess water from the saucer after the plant has had an hour or so to reabsorb it) water your plant with ice cubes that slowly melt. Decorate with small lights and light weight ornaments.

Don't forget to decorate your porch, patio or garden with colorful blooming plants. Sasanqua camellias are in their glory. Choose from bright red Yule Tide, clear white Setsugekka, soft pink Jean May, bright rose Kanjiro or bicolor

> Hana Jiman (white with a pink edge) just to name a few. Each has a different flower form and growth habit. Cyclamen are in full bud and bloom. These winter favorites are great bright shade/morning sun performers. Choose from red, white, pink, rose and lavender shades. Consider English primroses as well. They

come in red, white, rose, pink,

yellow and blue.




